

# WHITE ELEPHANT SALE RETURNS MARCH 5–6, 2011, WITH "WILD WILD WES" THEME

## Preview Sale Scheduled for January 30, 2011

(OAKLAND, CA) November 23, 2010—The Bay Area's most sought after warehouse sale returns this **March 5 and 6, 2011**, with a preview sale scheduled for **January 30**. Organized and presented by the Oakland Museum Women's Board to benefit the **Oakland Museum of California (OMCA)**, the legendary **White Elephant Sale (WES)** presents for sale an extensive offering of quality used Vintage clothing, fine jewelry, Asian collectibles, tools, furniture, sporting goods, and more. The annual sale is made possible by donations by the public.

The 2011 White Elephant Sale—themed **Wild Wild WES**—features quality used items for sale and promises to be the biggest and best treasure hunt in the West. Sale hours are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. both days and admission is **FREE**. First-time shoppers are advised to arrive early, wear comfortable shoes, and use the **free shuttle service** from the Fruitvale BART to the Sale warehouse.

The **Preview Sale**, a must for serious shoppers, will take place **Sunday**, **January 30**, **2011**, from **10 a.m. to 4 p.m**. Tickets to the Preview Sale are \$15 in advance (available at www.whiteelephantsale.org after December 1, 2010) and \$20 at the door. Children under 12 are admitted free when accompanied by an adult.
