WHAT: OMCA's new contemporary arts series—the Oakland Standard—kicks

WHEN: Friday, February 4

12–3PM LIVE BROADCAST Put the Needle on the History of the California DJ

Billy Jam broadcasts music and conversation about California DJ culture in a live remote broadcast from WFMU. OMCA's ticketing area turns into a DJ booth featuring some of California's top turntable guests spinning records for the broadcast, including: Pam the Funktress (The Coup and BASS), DJ Platurn (Oakland Faders), DJ Quest (Live Human and Space Travelers), Dawgisht (live beats), Mista B, DNZ, and Deeandroid. Emerging talent DJ Mia Moretti joins the conversation before her performance later in the evening.

9:30PM LIVE PERFORMANCE Turf Feinz perform on OMCA's Oak Street Plaza

The Turf Feinz perform turfing—a form of urban street dance that originated in East Oakland as a memorial dance for family and friends killed in police and gang violence. A style of elegiac breakdancing, turfing has won global admiration. A video of the Turf Feinz dance "RIP Rich D," performed at the intersection of MacArthur and 90th and shot and edited by YAK Films, currently has over 2 million YouTube hits.
