(Oakland, CA) May 2, 2011—The Bay Area's legendary White Elephant Sale raised an unprecedented \$1.6 million at the 52nd annual sale held in March 2011. With all proceeds benefiting the Oakland Museum of California (OMCA), volunteers are already preparing for the Sale's return on March 3 and 4, 2012. The 2012 preview sale is scheduled for January 29.

Organized and presented by the Oakland Museum Women's Board, the White Elephant Sale provides an extensive offering of quality used items, including vintage clothing, fine jewelry, Asian collectibles, tools, furniture, sporting goods, and more. The annual event is made possible by donations from the public.

"This year we raised \$1.6 million and set a new record," said Sheri Guthrie, marketing chair of the Oakland Museum Women's Board. "We thank all our wonderful donors and shoppers for their support and gratefully acknowledge the more than 1,000 volunteers whose untiring efforts continue to make the White Elephant Sale a huge success."
