FINAL WEEK OF MICHAEL C. McMILLEN AT OAKLAND MUSEUM OF CALIFORNIA

First-ever career retrospective of famed California artist closes Sunday, August 14

(OAKLAND, CA) August 8, 2011—The public has only one week left to enjoy the first-ever career retrospective of artist Michael C. McMillen, on view at the Oakland Museum of California (OMCA). Closing this Sunday, August 14, the exhibition *Michael C. McMillen: Train of Thought* spans the 40-year career of the internationally renowned Southern California-based mixed-media artist.

Featuring large-scale multisensory installations, assemblages, sculptures, paintings, drawings, and films on view throughout OMCA's Gallery of California Art, the exhibition invites viewers into a made-up world—a skill for which McMillen is best known. Using cast-off materials and architectural references as a metaphoric language, McMillen transports viewers into a distinctly different conceptual reality. The rough-hewn elegance of his fabrications challenge the concepts of time and change, often drawing on elements of Dada and Surrealism.
