
With that being said how do you think we can keep the culture alive while still moving forward?

be forgotten if the people let it be forgotten. Just because crack came and messed up the community, doesn't mean that all the culture is forgotten - it's still here regardless.


What's your favorite thing about being from Oakland?


Man, just the black pride, all pride, black pride, brown pride, the culture is so diverse, that's why I love Oakland.




