California Art

Discover California's evolving role as a leading center of visual expression through painting, sculpture, photography, craft and decorative arts, self-taught and folk art, and new media. The gallery features seminal works by artists such as Albert Bierstadt, Dorothea Lange, Hung Liu, Richard Diebenkorn, Walter Gordon Philips, Joan Brown, and Barry McGee.

California History

Explore history with no single storyline, no fixed narrative. California has always been a place of great diversity. The story begins with its Indigenous people and continues through to today with the increasing influx of people from all over the world. Discover the intersection of different cultures, languages, ambitions, and experiences—and begin to add your own to the story.

California Natural Sciences

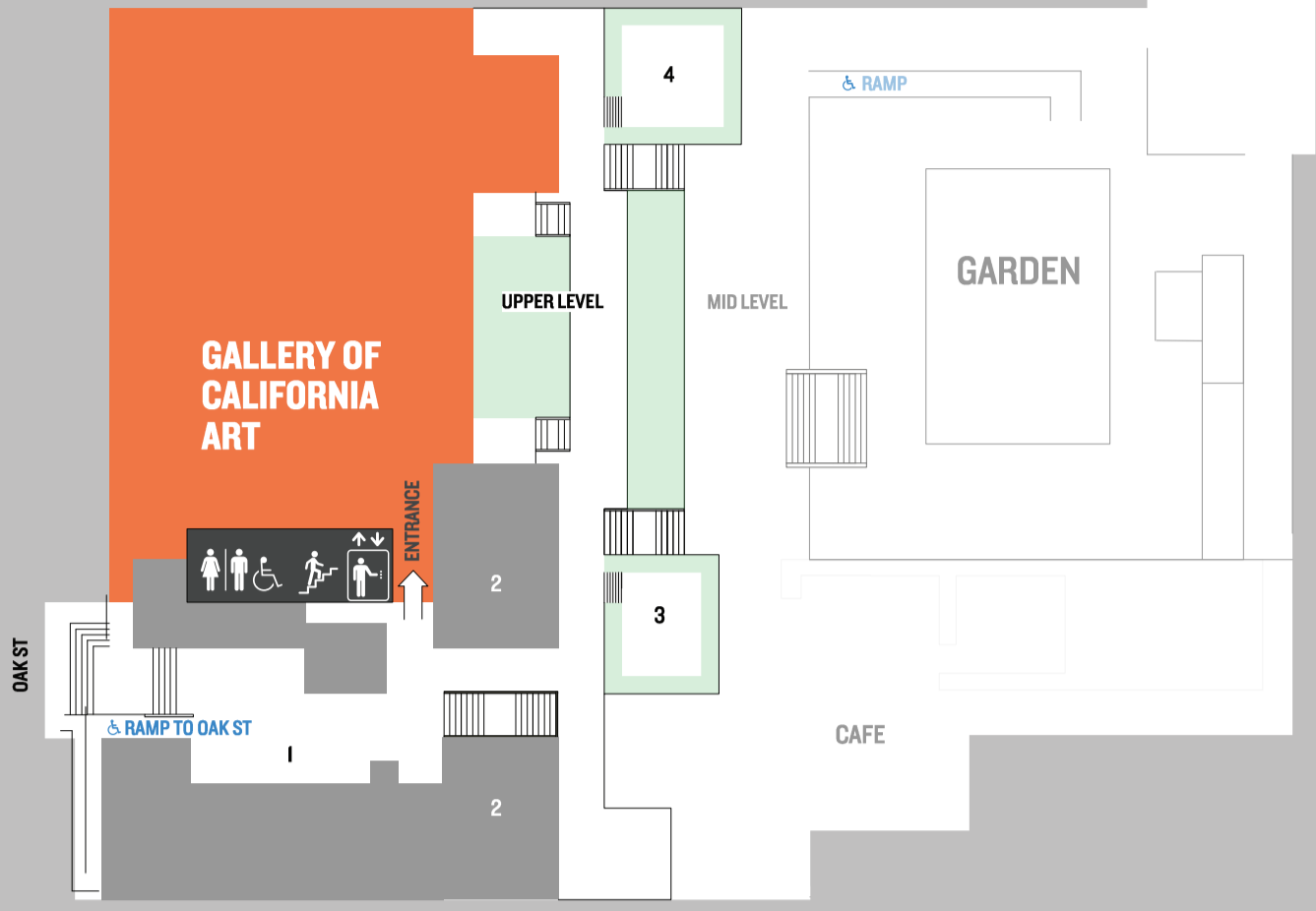

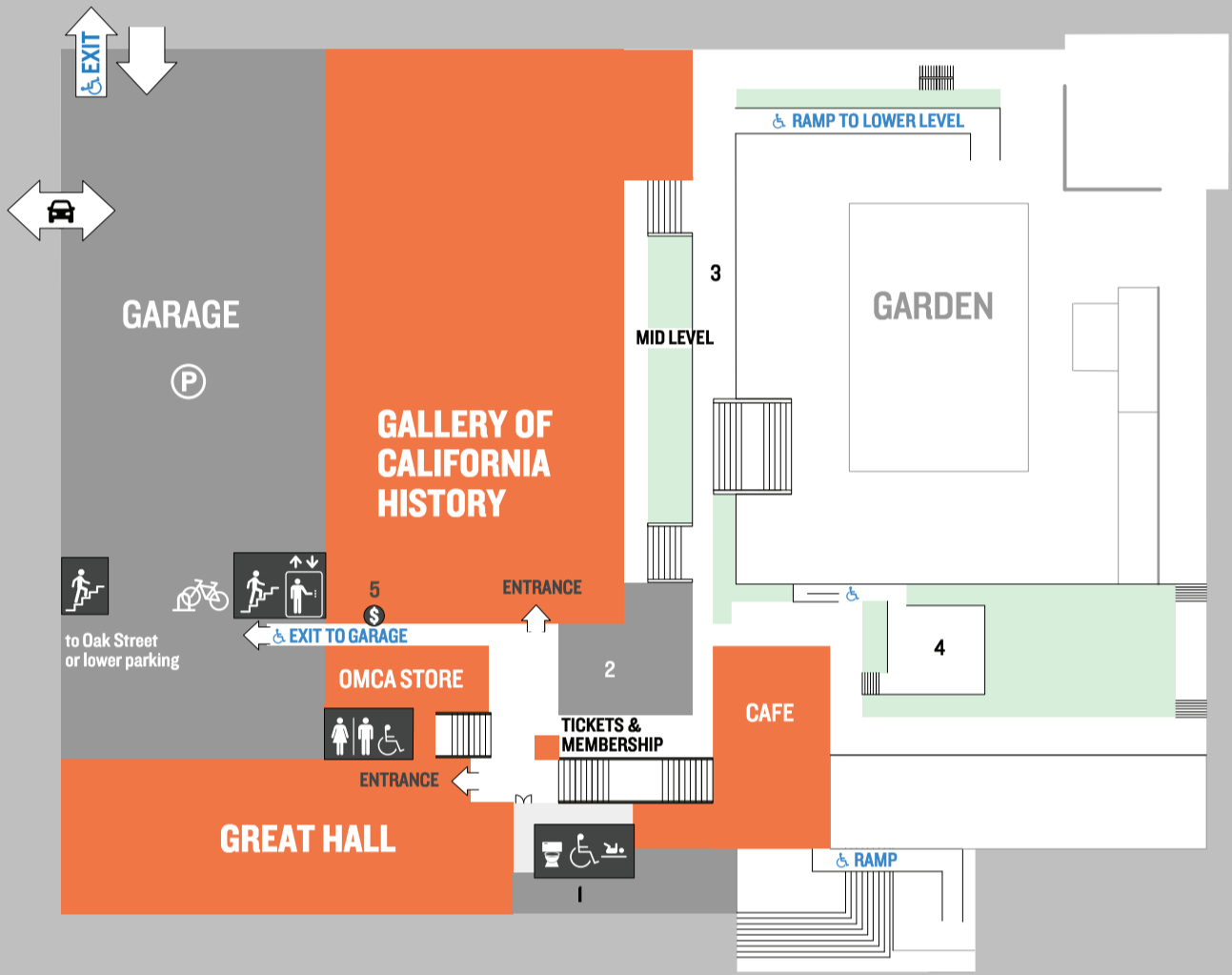

Accessible ramp to Oak Street

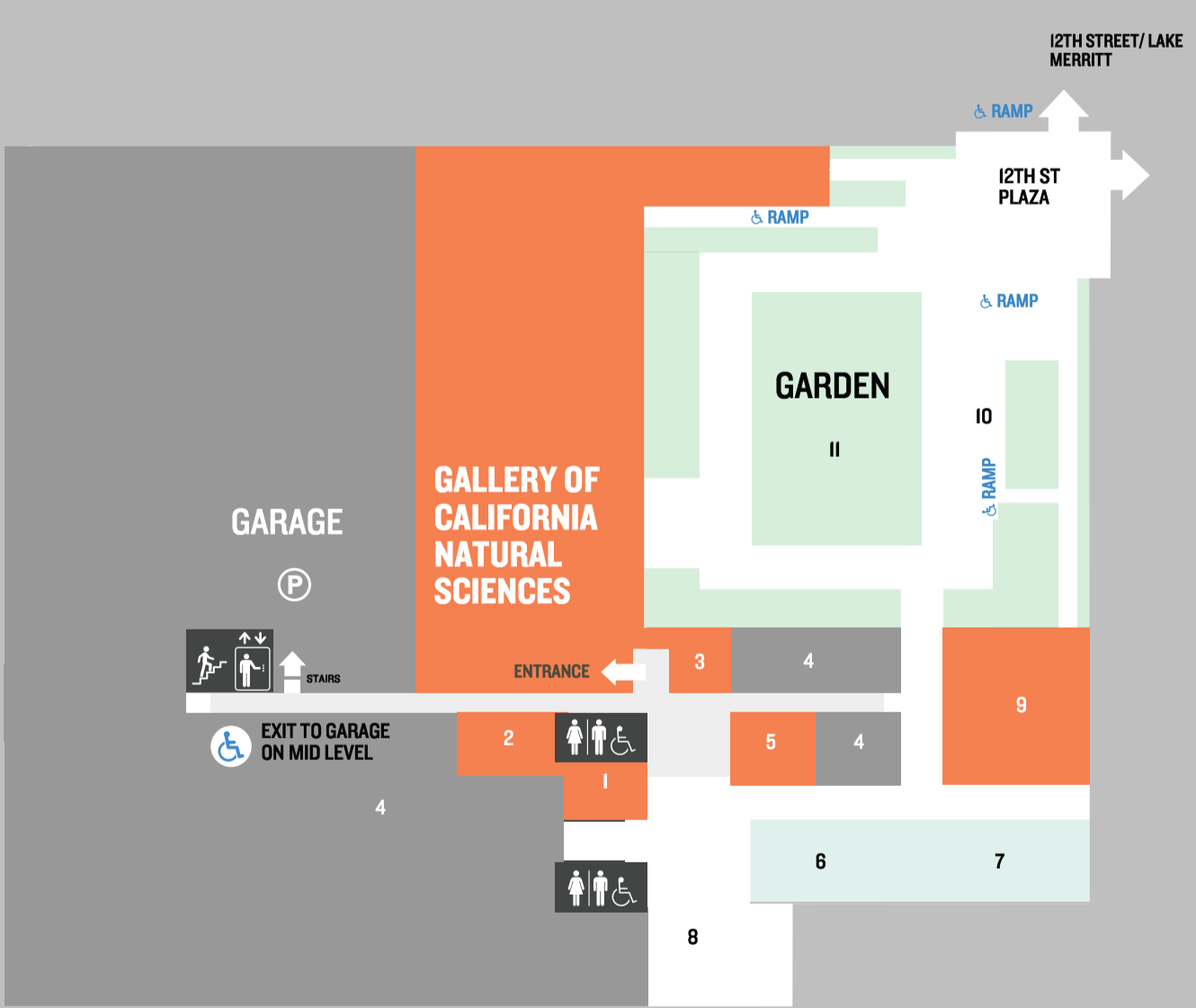
